For our spiritual life, this month is also a time of preparation, or it should be, if we do not allow the material items to get in the way. This time of year starting the fourth Sunday before Christmas is called Advent. During these four Sundays we will focus on getting ready for the baby Jesus once again. His adopted son, Dooley, wrestles with his own vision to become a successful country vet. Does Mitford take care of it's own? This is a large print book.
