that has happened they decide there is no need for God until the next problem. As Christians, we should seek to be walking with God every moment of our day.

Imagine what it would be like if we were living when Jesus walked the earth. What wonderful experiences we could have had daily. We would have heard Jesus day by day expound on the Scriptures. We would have seen miracles and healings. We would have gotten personal instructions on prayer, fellowship, and sharing our testimony. Yet those who walked with Jesus did not receive everything they needed all at once to follow Jesus and to grow deep in a relationship with God. Jesus' words in John 16:12,13 (NIV) say:

I am amazed at Jesus' words to the disciples. He tells them there is so much more for them to learn but they are not ready yet. 




The Nellie Bausell Library Notes June 2017
