PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

The Season of Lent

On March 1, we begin a time of preparation for Easter and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. This time of the Christian year is called Lent and it has been celebrated since the early days of the church. In these early days it was a time of preparation for those who would join the church at their baptism on Easter Sunday morning. The first mention of Lent as 40 days happens in 325 A.D. It is not, as some think today, for only certain denominations but is a time beneficial for all Christians to walk through. Lent is defined as the 40 days of reflection on the suffering and passion of Christ before Easter not including the Sundays. The Sundays are

always days of celebration throughout the Christian year.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday with a service remembering that we come from the earth and will return to the earth one day. Many churches who celebrate Ash Wednesday will save their palm leaves from the previous Palm Sunday to burn to use for their ashes during this service. The ashes are placed on the forehead in the shape of the cross often with the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The ashes help us to remember our own mortality and the cross helps us to remember the hope of the resurrection.

There are a number of practices people normally follow for Lent. Some will give up a pleasure (candy, soda, potato chips, etc.) for this time in order to identify with the suffering and temptation of Christ. Others will do an anonymous act of service for someone else each day. Fasting is a common practice. Fasting often means from food and drink but you can also fast from TV, social media, or any number of things. The main idea for fasting is to use the time you would normally use for that activity to spend a concentrated time in prayer with God. Some, when

walking through Lent, will schedule specific times for additional prayer in their lives. I have for many years now spent Lent centering on one person within the Easter story to better understand Easter.

I want to encourage you to add one of these practices to your walk with God this Lent season. Maybe I will see you at an Ash Wednesday service or later that day with a cross on your forehead. It is possible I could hear you speak with someone else about what you are setting aside for the time of Lent to better understand how Christ set aside things for you to have life. I might even hear about how fasting from something has helped you to better focus on God.

Lent is centering on the low points of Jesus Christ's journey here on earth so we can better see the high point of Easter resurrection Sunday. Easter does not happen without suffering, crucifixion, and burial.

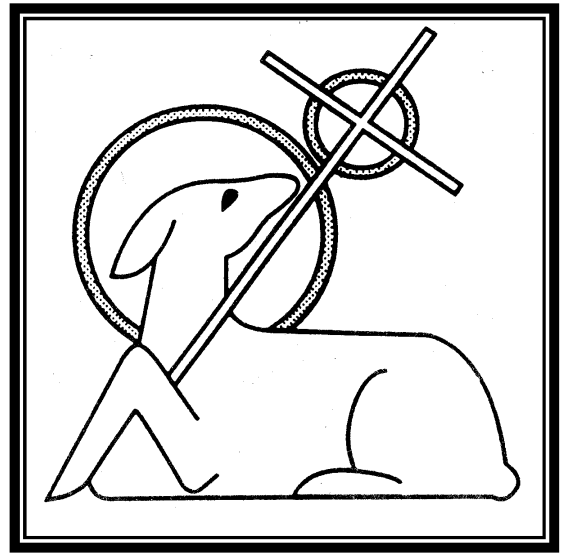

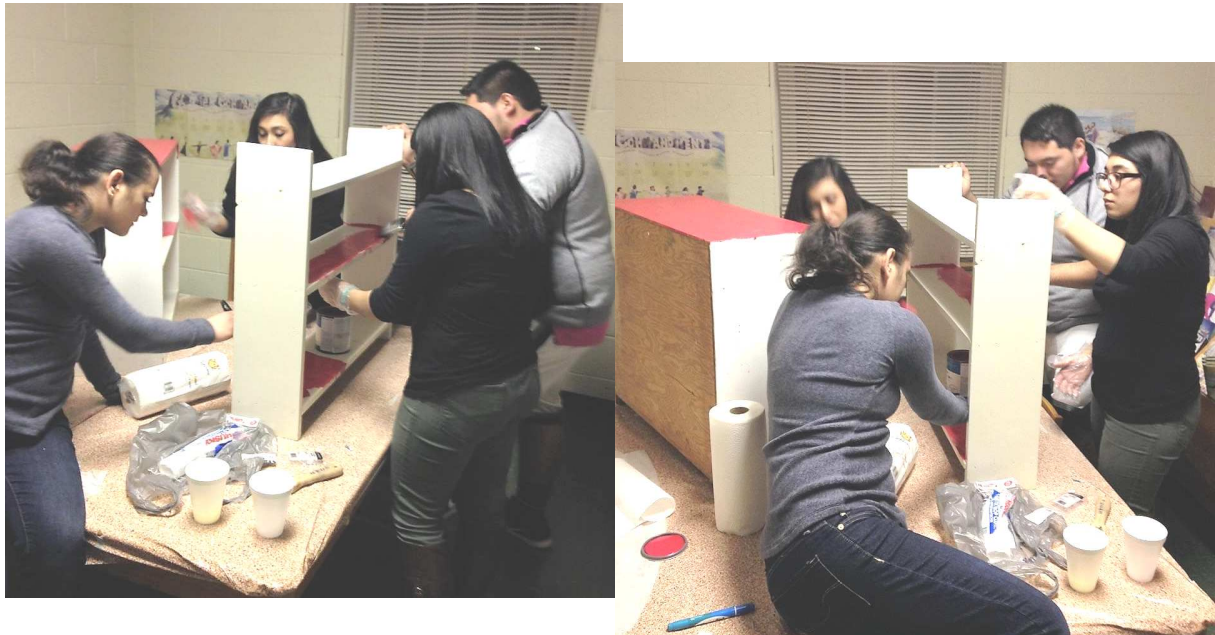
COME RING THOSE BELLS

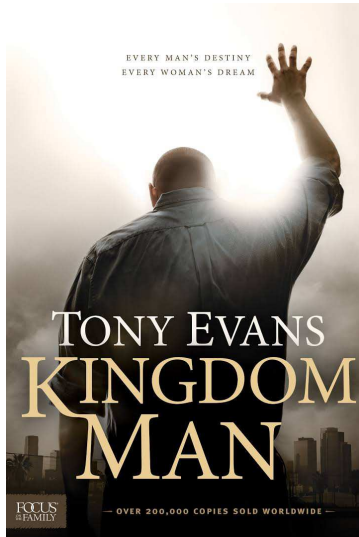

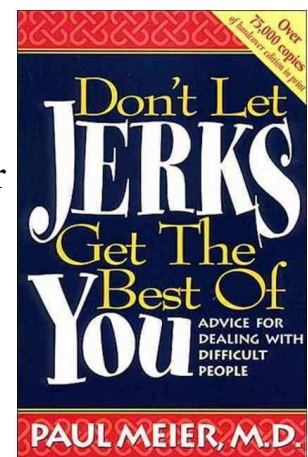

- ◆ The team monitoring the BGAV's funding of our BCMs reported last month that Jaye and Mark Aker are now interim leaders at Radford. The BGAV hopes to have a permanent leader in place no later than June of 2017. While their salary is fully funded by the BGAV, a permanent leader will be expected to raise over \$900 per month of their own support.
- ◆ The Radford's BCM program is going to need our Network's financial help no later than June of 2017. A new person coming into the Leadership position at Radford will not have a local support system. The monitoring team feels they may need \$300 to \$600 per month from us to get started. The Leadership Team voted to notify the BGAV, they can count on at least \$300 per month from WBRBN. I have communicated our commitment to Wilford in Richmond. He is very grateful for our support of the Baptist Collegiate Ministries in this area. Your support will go a long way to get a well qualified leader at Radford. Please pray for God to guide Wilford and his team in their search.
- ◆ As reported last month Darrell Cook, Leader of Virginia Tech's Baptist Collegiate Ministries will have until January 2018 to raise approximately 20% of his annual support. With the money our monitoring team is recommending, plus others, Darrell has received pledges for about 1/3 of the total he needs next year.
