





It's Time For Shoeboxes!!

It's time for my yearly plea to all of you for help in a very important mission project—
Operation Christmas Child.

Wytheville Baptist Church will once again be a Relay Center. We will have hours of operation each day between November 13-20 *and we need your help*. There will be a sign-up sheet in the back of



the sanctuary for those who would like to volunteer. We would like to have our church surpass our collection amount from last year and I am challenging our membership to pack 155 shoeboxes. Ideas to pack your shoebox: small toys, balls, jump ropes, small musical instruments, school supplies, hygiene items (toothbrush, bar soap in plastic bags, comb, washcloth), socks, tee-shirts, hats, gloves, sunglasses.

DO NOT INCLUDE—toothpaste, liquids, medicines, candy of any kind, toys promoting violence.

Use an empty average size shoebox or a shoebox size plastic box. We also ask that you provide \$9 for shipping. Decide whether you want to pack your box for a girl or boy and for what age. Fill your boxes and bring them to the church during the week of November 13 -20. We ask that you also pray for all the boxes, those who will distribute them, and those who will receive them.

I Did it His Way The Story of Gleaning For The World by Ron Davidson.

There is a wonderful book floating around the church, mostly in the sanctuary, that you will want to read. *Life Together—The Classic Exploration of Christian Community* by Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Dietrich martyred by the Gestapo near the end of World War II. He left a legacy of writings that have become a prized testimony of faith and courage for Christians around the world. It reads like one of Paul's letters, giving practical advice on how life together in Christ can be sustained in families and groups. This book was placed in the library anonymously. It is for you to take, read it, and leave it for the next person to enjoy. This is a short read of only 122 pages, but an excellent book. If you see it, pick it up and read it; but don't forget to return it.






