United with Christ

Over 2000 years ago on a Sunday morning, some women decided to go to the tomb of Jesus to finish his burial preparations. His body was placed quickly in the tomb before sunset on Friday evening, the start of the Jewish Sabbath. The women found the stone had already been rolled away and a young man in a white robe was sitting on the right side. He told them, "Don't be alarmed, you are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." (Mark 16:6,7 NIV). Then

a most curious thing happened next. Mark 16:8 (NIV) says, "Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid."

The best manuscripts of the Gospel of Mark end with this verse. Why would Mark end his gospel with these words? We know they must have told someone, otherwise we would not know this part of the story. The women were afraid and confused. First, they expected to find the body of Jesus who they thought was going to be their Savior. It would have been much easier to believe the body was stolen then to wrap their minds around the fact that Jesus rose and is going ahead of them. How would people receive them if they told the story as the young man said? So the women decided not to tell anything.

Wait, we know they eventual told. Maybe Mark stops the story here to cause us to consider whether we will tell the story of Jesus Christ's resurrection. Will we go out and talk about a risen Lord who died for our sins and has victory over death? How will people receive us?

There are some who say, "I do not need to tell the story.

People will see it by the way I live my life?" That may be true but scripture says in Romans 10:14 (NIV), "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?"

The women told, will you?




