#### Longing to Be Filled

Everyone has within them a hole that longs to be filled. Some folks may not admit this but it is true. This hole keeps people searching for just the right item to fill it. At one moment in someone's life, the hole can be filled with a certain activity or possession. Then as time advances people realize it did not work. So the search begins again to find the right item to fill the hole. Lots of people will spend their whole life always seeking but yet never filling the hole.

People may even become as desperate as the prodigal son in Luke 15:11-32. This is the story of a young man who asked for his inheritance early, left his family, and sought his fame on his own. Once his inheritance was spent then he worked as a

hired hand feeding pigs. It is at this point that some of the key sentences of this story should jump out at us.

He longed to fill his stomach with the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything.

*"When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have food to spare, and here I am starving to death! (Luke 15:16-17 NIV)*

There was a hole in his stomach and he came to his senses. Once again he recognized the interior hole and realized what he had did not fill the hole.

Have you had the same thing to happen? Have you come to a place where you recognize the hole and then come to your senses? Notice

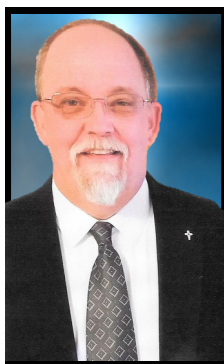

## The Nellie Bausell Library Notes

**August 2018**

*Knowing Scripture* by R.C. Sproul is a practical tool for interpreting the Bible. The Bible is the written Word of God, and it is treasured in many of our homes. But it is also an ancient book about people and cultures very different from us. So, while we know we should read it, many of us don't because we have a hard time understanding the Bible.

In this updated edition of *Knowing Scripture*, Mr. Sproul helps us dig out the meaning of Scripture for ourselves. The author says, "The theme of this book is not how to read the Bible but how to study the Bible." He presents in simple, basic terms a commonsense approach to studying Scripture and gives eleven practical guidelines for biblical interpretation and applying what we learn. With a minimum of technical jargon, Sproul tackled some of the knotty questions regarding differences of interpreting the Bible.

*All Rivers To The Sea* is a historical fiction by Bodie and Brock Thoene. It is October 1844. With the death of the evil Colonel Mahon and the greatest harvest of potatoes in living memory, it looks like peace and prosperity are finally on the way to the village of Ballyknockanor. But this is only the calm before the storm. Politically, British invaders threaten to undermine the movement for Irish independence, but it is the impending potato blight that very well may end all dreams and destroy a centuries-old way of life.

As Kate waits for the birth of their baby, Joseph is in hiding in London, trying to find a way to come to Ireland and assure himself of his beloved wife's safety. But plot and counterplot stand between him and a sweet reunion with those he loves.

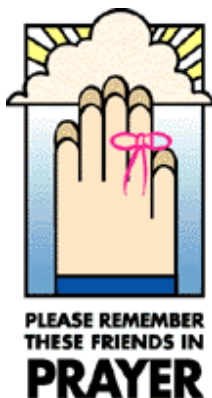
