years. We were not born when Calvary happened. What Jesus Christ walked through is far different than our lives today. Yet when you read scripture it talks about us being united with Christ in his death, burial, and resurrection. How can this be? Does it make a difference to our life if we consider ourselves "United with Christ" in his experience here on earth 2000 years ago?

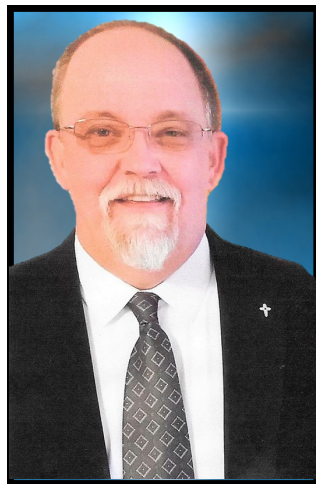
Paul, in Romans 6:5-11, says it does make a difference to understand being "United with Christ." Christ died a horrible death on the cross, was buried, and then was resurrected to a newness of life. In Christ's death, the body was freed from sin's power. Paul says to be united with Christ in his death and his resurrection frees us from the power that sin has over our body. Verse 6 (NIV) says, *"For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin."* Our bodies are no longer slaves to sin when we are "United with Christ!"

We should set aside the idea of standing on our own two feet. When we live on our own, we are not united with Christ in his life, death, burial, and resurrection. It is only

when we put our complete trust in Christ and live our lives through Christ that sin is no longer master over us. Taking back any part of our lives to live it on our own is like making our own truth for each new situation. Why would we want to live with sin as our master instead of living "United with Christ?" When we live "United with Christ," we too are living a new life and sin is no longer master over us.

My prayer is that you will learn to live "United with Christ" and experience the fullness of the newness of life. As always, I would love to discuss this further with you.

NOTES FROM OUR MINISTER OF MUSIC AND WORSHIP

SINGING FROM THE HEART

Our staff is studying *Life Together* by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, renowned Christian minister, seminary professor, author, and eventual martyr to the cause of Christ under Hitler. In his discussion of congregational singing, Mr. Bonhoeffer went so far to say that, "Where the heart is not singing there is no melody ... Where the singing is not to the Lord, it is singing to the honor of the self or the music, and the new song [Psalm 40] becomes a song to idols." A challenging indictment. He continued, "Why do Christians sing when they are together: ... because in singing together it is possible for them to speak and pray the same Word at the same time ... The fact that we do not speak it but sing it only expresses the fact that our spoken words are inadequate to express what we want to say, that the burden of our song goes far beyond all human words. Yet ... we sing *words* ... to God... Thus the music is completely

the servant of the Word." Good vocal music will enhance and make clearer the meaning of the words—especially in Christian music, not becoming a separate entity with the singer enjoying the melody over focusing on the Lord and meaning of the song. That is why our hearts thrill to certain words as the melody rises and takes on sobriety as the melody falls and remains low. For the purpose of congregational and church music is not performance and personal enjoyment, but worship to our God Who is worthy of our *full* attention and praise.

In talking with a dear missionary friend—who has financed her mission trips by cleaning houses for 30 years and, at 87, has just returned from two trips and was packing for her fourth trip to the Andes mountains in Peru—she said research is finding that singing is beneficial physically, mentally and emotionally. So scanning

Speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord

Ephesians 5:19

the Internet, I found—just as she said—research has proven or is indicating the following benefits to singing, to name a few. **PHYSICALLY:** strengthens the immune system (even in cancer), improves the heart, helps with lung function (including mild asthma), helps with sleep, lowers severity of snoring, is an exercise workout, can improve posture; **MENTALLY/EMOTIONALLY:** antidepressant, lowers stress levels, improves mental alertness (also in Alzheimer's), improves quality of life; **SOCIALLY:** widens circle of friends, offers increased social bonding, confidence, and communication skills. When God tells us to do something (Eph.

5:19), there are always loving benefits hidden in our obedience.

So during the soul-searching of Lent, the joy of Easter, and in everyday life: Let's sing ... but from the heart — or else we are only entertaining ourselves and the melody rises no higher. May each of us experience the blessings of Lent and Easter that come only as we give ourselves totally to the Lord, receiving His love gifts showered in our obedience to His Word and His commandments. My prayer for us all: Psalm 40:1-3,

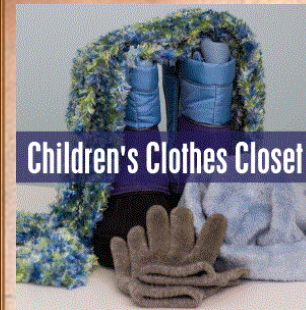

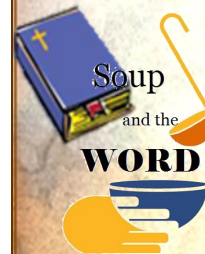
