PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

Taking Time to Process

There are so many items to get done every day. We have a plan and it is frustrating when we are not able to accomplish our plan. Sometimes we set items aside and hope they will complete themselves or maybe someone else will do them. There are even items we feel are not necessary, yet for some reason we still complete the task. Then something crashes right into all that is happening. It often is a shock and unsettles us. It may stop us in our tracks, making us completely unproductive.

This very thing happened to a man named Saul in Acts 9:1-9. He had his plan; it was a plan to stop the new Jesus movement from growing. His greatest desire was to crush it completely. Saul felt

to eliminate all people in this new movement. Saul attained the rights to kill any people he found who followed Jesus. As he was carrying out his plan for God, God in the form of Jesus Christ interrupted him. "Why are you fighting against me?" Jesus Christ asked. Saul did not have an answer and

process how God is leading and guiding us. If during this time we feel that our plan is not God's plan then we need to scrap our plan and change paths.

This is exactly what Saul did and became known as the Apostle Paul: church planter, writer, and encourager of those

was physically and mentally blinded by this experience. For three days, Saul sat and waited. During this time Saul did not eat or drink. His whole plan was derailed.

What do we do when we find our plan derailed? Are we willing to pause and reflect on our experience? I believe Saul spent those three days reflecting and processing what he had just experienced. He was seeking to understand how he had turned down a path that was not God's way.

We can learn from Saul. I believe it is good to schedule moments of reflection on the spiritual journey. These moments should include processing what we feel God is saying through scripture, through prayer, through other people, and through circumstances. This is not a ten minute task but must involve a longer period of time to really

who follow Jesus Christ. If you have not recently taken the time to process and reflect on your spiritual journey then schedule time now. Make it an appointment you will keep as you would any other appointment on the calendar. Ask God to show you the path God desires for you to walk. If it is different than the path you are currently walking then pray asking God to show you how to walk God's path.

Pastor Ramon Tovar continues to feed people both physically and spiritually with the \$300 we are sending each month. Inflation was 4000% in 2017 and is expected to hit 13,000% in 2018. As an example, a loaf of bread that cost a bolivar in 2016 cost 41 bolivar this year and at the end of this year is expected to cost 131 times what it cost today. Pray that he will be able to find food to buy for the people in his church and community with the dollars we are sending.

NOTES FROM OUR MINISTER OF MUSIC AND WORSHIP

GLORY ON THE MOUNTAINTOP

My deepest gratitude goes to everyone who participated in "A Lamb, by Choice." Our main prayer was for the Lord's power to descend upon all; and most everyone I've talked with has spoken of just that. "I was on the mountaintop last night ..." – a comment immediately followed by her husband's words, "And we need those mountaintops!" Another said she felt the Lord's power pounding in her heart during "Feel the Nails." In fact, many of us experienced a "miracle," when, after many prayers, Rick Walker's Monday sore throat suddenly went away during "Feel the Nails" and "Hallelujah (Easter Version)," as if there had never been a problem. Several said they couldn't believe there were only nine or ten voices singing—that they sounded like fifty, which truly had to be a miracle.

And the Lord's Hand literally took control from the first note. When I made a large motion to the pianist, the choir took it as the signal to

begin, and suddenly came in strongly, perfectly together, and in the desired tempo even though it was a beat or two before they were supposed to start! I was so startled that it took me several moments to "come to" and realize that I certainly was not in control, even though I felt my right arm moving. Only the Lord and I knew who the True Conductor was at that point. What peace it brought as my burden of responsibility was taken from me and put on HIS Mighty Shoulders.

More miracles will surface, but there'll be many we won't know until glory. The gifts of the heart and sacrifice by all was truly a miracle to me. There was the creation of the gorgeous set by Jerry and Jan Stone and their family, our backstage and media/lighting team's amazing job that impacted the entire presentation. When we lost our "Peter/Barabbas" four hours before Monday night's presentation, Noah Willis rushed from ball practice to
