



Shoe Box ministry is from November 12-19, 2018.








Join Mary and Joseph inside a stable, beside a shepherd, at the feet of the King as you read *In The Manger:25 inspirational selections for Advent* by best-selling author Max Lucado.

WHY?: Trusting God When You Don't Understand. Can you keep on trusting God when bad things are happening all around you—when the pain is sharp, the doubt is deep, and it's impossible to see the sense in it all? You can do just that, says best-selling author and speaker, Anne Graham Lotz, if you keep your eye on the big picture of who God is, what His purposes are, and just how passionately He cares about His children.
