Christ as their Lord and Savior. Then we should help them to come to know Jesus Christ by trusting him for salvation and eternal life. When they do they become a new life in the Kingdom of God. Our helping them at this point is even more important. We must teach them now what it means to walk as a follower of Jesus Christ, We must help them understand the Bible, establish prayer and devotion time, know how to share their testimony of coming to Jesus Christ, and many other disciplines of the faith. Too many churches for too long have focused only on bringing people to Jesus Christ and then hoping they will continue in the faith while they look for new people to evangelize.

In the past few months, God has convicted me greatly to see how I have fallen down in my ministry in making disciples. The concept of discipleship has always run like a thread through all my teaching, preaching, and counseling. It is as though I had a bucket of marbles that I tossed out at every opportunity hoping someone would pick up a marble and be captured by what it means to live as a disciple of Jesus Christ, Certainly, there are those who have picked up a marble and caught the vision.

Yet I have often not followed through on helping them. They have often had to find their own way while I spread more marbles.

So now that I have lost most of my marbles (said it before anyone else does), I realize how important it is that I become more intentional about making disciples. Later this year I am starting a Discipleship Class to help people grow in their discipleship. The first ones through this class will be asked to make a commitment to lead others in the same way. Thus we as a Church will be able to fulfill our calling of making disciples not just giving birth to new members of the Kingdom of God.

Begin praying now to see if God is calling you to step forward in your discipleship. If God is touching your heart to help start this process please let me know. Also, be in prayer as I discern how best to do this most important calling.

NOTES FROM OUR MINISTER OF MUSIC AND WORSHIP

IT MAY BE FRIDAY . . . BUT SUNDAY'S A-COMIN'

Eastertide, the season set aside to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, continues throughout May until Pentecost Sunday, June 9th. Hopefully the celebration of our Lord's resurrection would shine through our lives throughout the year.

At this writing, we are in the midst of Holy Week, pondering our Lord's crucifixion on Friday and the joy to come on Resurrection Sunday. Against the promises of the empty tomb for Christians, we see the world celebrating the season with, among other things, hollow chocolate bunnies – sadly a picture of the hollowness and emptiness of their hearts and lives without the Savior.

Then again this week, we have watched in horror as Notre Dame







The Nellie Bausell Library Notes May 2019

The Library Has Four Old Cook Books.

Here is a little history to go with the cookbooks. The first one was printed in December 1916 and by checking our records it was compiled by the women of Wytheville Baptist for the Building Fund and sold for 50 cents a copy. You may remember some of these ladies who provided the recipes: Mrs. George R. Huffard, Mrs. Clarence Trinkle, Mrs. Hope Davidson, Mrs. J.S. Repass, Mrs. W.M. Lindamood, Mrs. W.E. Abrams (the Pastors wife), Mrs. Stuart Campbell, Mrs. A.A. Campbell, Mrs. John E. Tarter, Mrs. W.S. Moore, Mrs. S.S. Stephens, Mrs. W.S. Poage, Mrs. S.J. Kincer, Mrs. John Felty, and Mrs. G. T. Folty, to name just a few. Mr. J. H. Harris gave WBC his wife's cookbook dated December 1916. Also, one of the 1916 cookbooks was given to Pastor Wesley Huff by Mrs. Elizabeth B. Tompkins. She said "I am happy to donate this little cook book to the church. I knew it would mean nothing to my children. Some of your 'parishioners' can find names in it of old families. My mother used to have relatives in Wytheville. I was from Monroe County, WV. We had many ties to Virginia. You have a pretty church in a pretty town. I miss seeing the beautiful mountains especially in the fall."

There was a second book printed in July 1921. That one was for the purchase of the organ for the church. It sold for 65 cents a copy.

The third copy of this book was dated 1932 and sold for \$1.00 per copy. Grace Bounty of Stanford, CT, called the church, Jan sent her to me, and I told her we would love to have the cookbook. She told me she had found it in a 'tag' sale and hated to see it thrown out, so she called us and sent it to us for our church history.

Come to our library and take a look at them. They are loaded with great recipes. We are in the process of searching for more of WBC's history. Please visit the library and explore some of our history; you never know what you might find.
