As we approach Holy Week, are we prepared to walk the journey which Jesus made in his last week? Jesus told the disciples several times that he was going to Jerusalem. NOTES FROM OUR MINISTER OF MUSIC AND WORSHIP

JOURNEY TO THE CROSS



We have just experienced the pain of not being able to worship the Lord together in our beautiful sanctuary. The choir was preparing a musical presentation for Palm Sunday, "Journey to the Cross," which is included below for meditation. It is our prayer that these words will draw each of us closer to our Lord as we relive His great Love for us:

"This is a true story of a journey propelled by love—the love of a mighty God and the people He had created. It's the story of perfection that was destroyed, of mercy that was extended, and of God's faithfulness through it all. Despite humanity's rebellion and disobedience, God' plan to set things right kept unfolding.

There are times the Almighty's voice thundered with judgment. Sometimes it was a song of comfort. For 400 years He was simply silent. Then one night in Bethlehem, everything changed.

As a boy, Jesus roamed the hills of Nazareth. At 12, He stood in the Temple and spoke of tending to His Father's business. At 30, He was baptized as John proclaimed Him "the Lamb of God." Then for three years, He traveled throughout the land healing the sick, delivering the broken, loving the outcast, and even raising the dead.

At last the road turned again to Jerusalem. As He rode into the city, crowds greeted Him, the way they would greet a conquering king.

Jesus knew what was waiting ahead as the journey that had taken thousands of years descended into deep shadows. Powerful religious and political forces aligned to destroy Him. One who had posed as a faithful follower betrayed Him for the price of a slave. But first the Lord would eat the Passover meal with His friends. He had one more opportunity to show them His love and prepare them for the coming day.

In Gethsemane, Jesus prayed alone. The first drops of blood that he would shed on our behalf trickled down His brow as He surrendered to His Father's will.

Soldiers arrived to arrest Him and the long night of trial and torture began. He was sentenced to death by crucifixion. He was stripped and scourged and mocked. And then He carried His own cross up the hill of Golgotha, where He opened His arms, submitted to the nails in His hand and feet, and laid down His life willingly in your place and mine.

On the hillside that day, the message Jesus had come to deliver was unmistakable. God loved us so much, He would do whatever it took to save us.

Just when it looked like the story of Jesus would end in defeat, Heaven revealed a new chapter called 'Victory.'"

And it is in that Victory that we now live . . . and in that Hope that comes from Life in Jesus, that we can overcome whatever this old world hurls at us. "Hallelujah! What a Savior!" He is risen! He is risen, indeed!
