**LIVE MUSIC AT CHURCH SERVICES**



Though we were unable to open in July as planned, the Lord has provided a way we can have live music safely when we do reopen. After researching the use of plexiglass as a barrier for singers, Chris Bracknell of the Property Team and I discussed ways to remove the middle pew of the choir loft and erect a plexiglass shield. With singers behind the shield, the congregation would be protected from even any aerosol droplets. I mentioned a plexiglass drum shield as an example which caused him to remember that the church had one that they used in the contemporary services. Chris located the beautiful 5 x 10-foot foldable shield off the Fellowship Hall.

With additional plexiglass inserts along the width, several cubicles could be made to enable even two or more singers to practice and perform at the same time. Chris and his team plan to erect the plexiglass before our first service to allow, first of all, for a solo. Then as we see how the pandemic is going, we have the option to add additional panels. The idea of having to use videos was difficult, so I'm very grateful the Lord has shown us the way to have our wonderful soloists once again bless us in person.

## Youth News

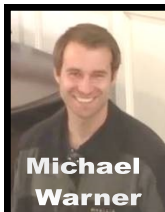
### ***Hello Church Family,***

### Meeting Real Needs in Real Time

## Alma Hunt

Offering for Virginia Missions

The Alma Hunt Offering for Virginia Missions will look different in the coming year, reflecting the changing world in which we live as we face the challenges of a global pandemic.

This annual state missions offering is a joint venture of Woman's Missionary Union of Virginia (WMUV) and the Baptist General Association of Virginia (BGAV).

As always, this critical offering seeks to meet real needs of real people by funding ministries in a variety of specific areas. For the rest of 2020 and looking toward 2021, the allocations of this offering are being redirected in a way that will allow us to focus on human needs arising from the COVID-19 crisis.

#### Changes in Distribution

The state missions offering will be distributed as follows:

- 70% of funds to WMUV-directed projects
- 30% of funds to BGAV-directed projects
- All projects have a direct correlation to COVID-19 relief efforts
- Funds will be distributed monthly and will begin in Summer 2020 in order to respond more quickly to immediate needs

Because of the time-sensitive nature of many of these critical needs and the plan to distribute funds monthly, we ask that you consider sending your offerings as early as possible this year.

#### WMUV-Directed Allocations\*

- Providing online and on-site training in various areas related to mental health and domestic violence. This will include providing information and referral resources for individuals and congregations.
- Providing grants to help continue the development of a missions lifestyle. Funds will be awarded to support women's and children's outreach ministries with a hands-on involvement component that meet human needs at home or around the world.
- Providing partial or full-summer camping scholarships to church families that cannot afford to send their children to summer camp due to the financial difficulties caused by COVID-19.

#### BGAV-Directed Allocations\*

- Providing financial relief to church planters who lost income from their churches and also from their non-church jobs that typically supply the majority of their income.
- Providing funds to BGAV churches that have ongoing Child Development Centers in order to provide scholarships to parents who must work but find themselves unable to pay for childcare.
- Providing funds to churches to assist them with offering WiFi hotspots so that students may participate in school online.
- Providing financial resources to partners around the world responding to COVID-19 among the most vulnerable people groups through our relationship with the Baptist Forum for Aid and Development.






\* Allocations may include other needs as they arise related to COVID-19 relief efforts.

# WBC REOPENS FOR WORSHIP SERVICE

**PRAISE THE LORD!** We will start meeting for Worship Service only on Sunday, August 2, at 10:30 a.m. This will be the only activity we will have at Church for a while. We will continue to meet for Prayer Meeting and Bible Study each week on Zoom. If you have not been attending on Wednesday and would like to, please email Pastor Tim at [42rebus@gmail.com](mailto:42rebus@gmail.com) for an invitation link.

The leadership of WBC understands most of you want to be as cautious as possible as we return to gathering together. We want to do all that we can to keep you safe and well during this time. Some have shared that they will not be coming at first as we start in-person gathering. The leadership of the Church understands this and if you decide it would be best for you to be safe by staying at home, you have the approval of Pastor Tim and the leadership to do so. We are still going to live stream the Worship Service on the Church's Facebook page and it will still be available on the Church's YouTube page. Please be aware of the social distancing rule of six-feet between non-family members. With this distancing, our Sanctuary will only hold about 50 people, which is less than our usual attendance.

Also, please read the read the Guidelines below.

## COVID-19 GUIDELINES AND CLEANING PROCEDURE

These guidelines follow State guidelines and suggestions of best practices for churches gathering for Worship Services.

We are happy to report that Wytheville Baptist will begin gathering for Worship Service only on August 2, 2020 at 10:30 a.m. We have established these guidelines and cleaning procedures to keep people safe during this time of Covid-19.

1. Worship Services will be limited to 50 people, this includes seating people in the balcony, so we can maintain six-foot distances between people. Our Worship Services will be live-streamed on the Church's Facebook page and posted later on the Church's YouTube page for those who cannot attend or who would prefer not to attend during this time of Covid-19.
2. No one with a fever or known exposure to a Covid-19 case in the prior 14 days is allowed to enter the church building.
3. The Sanctuary, Bathrooms on the Main Floor, and all frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned after each Worship Service before meeting again as explained in the cleaning procedure detailed below.



It's summer time and we have summer clothes in WBC Children's Clothes Closet. These children's clothes are free and we always have new families that utilize this ministry. If you have any new or gently used

children's clothes, shoes, new underwear, t-shirts, or socks; please bring them to the clothes closet down stairs next to the nursery when the church opens back up.

If you would like to make a monetary donation, please earmark your check "Children's Clothes Closet" and mail it to the church or drop it in the mail slot on the door leading to the main hallway. **If permissible**, the Children's Clothes Closet will open on Thursday, August 20, from 2:30 to 4:00 p.m.

## **OPEN DOOR CAFÉ IMPORTANT HEALTH & SERVICE NOTICE**

We will continue with To-Go style meals. Outdoor seating is now available to enjoy your to-go meals, but you may not seat yourself. Please see a volunteer to be seated. Masks must be worn except for when eating and drinking. Tables are reserved for active eating only of parties of 6 or less, and social gatherings outside of meals are prohibited. Monetary donations are still gladly accepted and needed as we work to serve all. The hours will remain 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.



## **AGAPE FOOD PANTRY**



Please bring canned vegetables for the months of August and September to help feed those in need in our community. Please, no glass containers.

WBC considers it a privilege to help the Agape Food Pantry distribute food on the second Saturday of every month beginning at 10:00 a.m. and the fourth Thursday of each month beginning at 12:00 p.m. If you would like to be part of this vital ministry, please contact Chris and Rhonda Bracknell or Guy and Linda Sutphin.

4. People will enter the Sanctuary through the front door while maintaining six-foot distances and proceed to a pew for the Worship Service. Please do not pause because this may keep people from entering behind you. The pews will be marked in six-foot sections and only every other pew will be used. It will be helpful to fill in the Sanctuary from the front to the back so people can maintain six-foot distancing. If you are handicapped and need to use the ramp please let us know and you will be led in through the side door.
5. We will not have an announcement sheet. Our announcements will be on the projector screens.
6. Those who attend Worship Services are reminded to wear a face mask and each will use hand sanitizer upon entering our Sanctuary. If you forget to bring a face mask you will be given one to wear as you enter the sanctuary. The Pastor will remove his mask when he preaches.
7. Families who have been living together through the pandemic can sit together. All other attendees must be seated six feet apart.
8. We will not have our Greeting Time of hugging, handshakes, and moving around the Sanctuary.
9. Music has been very important to our Worship Services, however, there will be no Congregational singing during our Worship Services. Special Music and instrumentals will be part of our Worship Services from time to time.
10. Other than the Sanctuary, no other parts of the Church facility will be open. Sunday School rooms, the Library, and the Choir Room are closed. Please do not go to the First or Third floors at this time. Any additional spaces people use will require cleaning each time they are used. The bathrooms will be open only on the Main floor.
11. Until further notice, there will be NO other Church activities held in the building.
12. The wearing of gloves is optional, but if you choose to wear gloves, they too need to be sanitized with hand sanitizer.
13. There will be an Offering plate at the entrance to the sanctuary to receive your offering. Offering plates will not be passed during the Worship Service. You can also continue to place your Offerings and Tithes through the mail slot in the door closest to the Office door during the week, mail it to the church, or use the online giving links either on the Church Website or through the My Church app.
14. At this time, no items can be passed from one person to another unless it is among the same family who have been living together during the stay-at-home orders.
15. After the worship service, the ushers will release one pew at a time to exit by the side door of the Sanctuary so we can maintain the required six-

foot distance.

16. Those who choose to fellowship are required to do so outside the Church Building away from the exit while remaining at the six-foot distance.

#### **CLEANING PROCEDURE BETWEEN WORSHIP SERVICES**

1. Our Cleaning Service will be responsible for sanitizing / disinfecting the restrooms. This will be done primarily with a bleach solution.
2. Our Cleaning Service will also sanitize / disinfect the hard surfaces of the entrance and exit doors to the sanctuary and in the hall.
3. A team of at least three individuals (members) will clean (sanitize / disinfect) the sanctuary each time the sanctuary is used. This will be done on or after Wednesday of each week. This cleaning will consist of wiping down of all the wood surfaces of the pews and other furniture. Lysol wipes and a non-bleach spray solution will be available for use. This would take less than an hour with two people. A steam cleaning machine will be used to sanitize / disinfect the fabric on the pews and any other needed fabric surfaces. The steam cleaning will likely take about 2 ½ hours.
