It was Jesus' last meal with the disciples (John 13:1-11). He got up from the table, removed his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around himself. He then began to wash the disciples' feet. This is a task that was normally done by a servant. We see Peter proclaim that he is not going to allow Jesus to do this for him. Peter felt as though the Lord should not be washing feet. In the end, Peter allows Jesus to wash his feet because he does not want to miss being part of the community.

There is a part of this passage that is quite often overlooked. All the disciples were present when Jesus served them by washing their feet. Yes, Jesus even washes the feet of Judas Iscariot fully knowing Judas plans to betray him. How

could Jesus do this for the one who will bring great sorrow to him and to many disciples? With an example of serving even someone who betrays, what does this mean for our service?

Yet, Jesus does for one who will make bad choices. Should this inform our ministry? Are we willing to help and serve those even when they continue to choose the wrong way to go?


