#### Seeing God's Work Around Us

The beginning of Moses' ministry has captured my attention. A burning bush that is not burning causes Moses to turn aside from his busy life of herding sheep for his father-in-law. As he approaches he hears the Lord of the entire universe speak to him about what is going to happen. It is at this point, we often concentrate on God's call on Moses' life to become a great leader. How fortunate that Moses hears this call and walks in the ways the Lord has for him. Yes, Moses does struggle with the call. Yes, Moses does tell the Lord that God has picked the wrong person. Yes, Moses does finally make the commitment and becomes the leader which does become the standard for all other leaders in Hebrew history.

However, there is a part of what the Lord says which is often overlooked.



Read these verses (Exodus 3:7-8b (NIV)) carefully to see what the Lord says first to Moses before calling him.

The Lord said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey...."

God says, "I have already decided to save my people because they have cried out to me." Then God tells Moses, "I want you to be their leader." We tend to emphasize the call of Moses over the decision the Lord has already made. If Moses had decided not to follow God, God was still going to save the people.

There are times we know what needs to be done and sit down to plan out how to do the work. Once we have put a plan together, we then ask God to bless our plan for the sake of the Kingdom. Sometimes it works and sometimes we fall flat. We then try to understand what happened. It was so successful when other churches have done it. Why did it not work here? I have learned there are times when God does not want us to follow how someone accomplished Kingdom work. God is already busy accomplishing the work and we need to see it and just join in with God.

In the past three months, I have seen God do some things around us which are different than what I know is happening in other churches. I am studying this and wondering, is God about a new or different work than what has happened here in the past? Do we need to change some of our plans so we can join God in what God is doing at Wytheville Baptist?

These are just some beginning thoughts for me. What are you seeing God do around us? I would love to hear your thoughts.

•FREE DISASTER RELIEF TRAINING: On January 18, BGAV will offer an Introduction to Disaster Response course followed by specialized Chainsaw certification training (including a classroom safety portion and a hands-on fieldwork portion). The Introduction to Virginia Baptist Disaster Response (VBDR) is classroom based and provides an overview of why we respond to disasters, how we organize and operate our responses, and what we do to help communities affected by disaster. Upon completion of this training, participants will be credentialed to serve with VBDR clean up teams, support teams, and mass feeding teams (additional online training is available for clean up and mass feeding which participants are encouraged to complete before joining a team, but "hands on training" will also occur in the field when you join a response).

The additional "hands on chainsaw training" will credential participants to be chainsaw operators with VBDR. Please come prepared to work outside most of the afternoon (sturdy shoes and warm (not loose fitting) clothing and safety glasses are required.

The Introduction course will begin at 8 am at the Baptist Camp 4353 Towes Ferry Rd, Dublin Virginia 24084. Chainsaw training will begin at approximately 10 am. You may come to either or both training. Ordinarily, the introduction course costs \$25 per person but as a "thank you" for the hard work and dedication the Network has given in building the bunk trailer, this training is being offered to you at no cost, so please come take advantage of the opportunity to be prepared to serve when disaster strikes. Please sign up for the training at https://vbmb.wufoo.com/forms/ s1rtbken1hnwkn2/ and coupon code BLUERIDGE (this will ensure that you will be able to register for free. Without the code, it will ask you to pre-pay the \$25 registration fee). The Network will provide lunch, at the camp, around noon.






