Called Church Business Meeting

During this time of COVID-19, we are seeking for new ways to be a church and also to take care of the business of the church. In addition to having a Called Business Meeting on Wednesday, July 1, at our 7:00 p.m. Prayer Meeting and Bible Study on Zoom, we want to give people an additional way to vote on church business. We realize not everyone can attend a Zoom meeting. You can respond to the church's email, wythevillebaptist@gmail.com, with either a "yes" or a "no" to allow the Property Team to have Wythe Sheet Metal replace one Sanctuary AC unit at a cost of \$6,000 and also to allow Brian Wolford to install a 22,000 BTU window unit with remote control for the kitchen. The installation for the kitchen will include two new circuits: one for the air conditioner and a new circuit for countertop cooking appliances. The unit will cost \$725 and other incidentals will bring the total cost to \$900 and \$1,000. Funds for the kitchen air conditioner project will come from the Designated line item for Wednesday night suppers which currently has \$4,873.14. If voting by email, your vote on both projects needs to be received by noon on Wednesday, July 1. If you have any questions please contact Chris Bracknell, Chairperson of the Property Team. Thanks for your help in conducting the business of the church.

Dear Faithful Members of Wytheville Baptist Church, After much prayer and discussion with a number of members and leaders, it is time for in-person Worship Services again. We will start meeting only for Worship Service on July 5 at 10:30 a.m. This will be the only activity we will have at Church for a while. We will continue to meet for Prayer Meeting and Bible Study each week on Zoom. If you have not been attending on Wednesday and would like to, please email me for an invitation link.

I know and am aware that most of you want to be as cautious as possible as we return to gathering together. As your Shepherd, I want to do all that I can to keep you safe and well during this time. I realize cases of COVID-19 are rising in our county. Some have shared with me they will not be coming at first as we start in-person gathering. I understand and so does the leadership of the Church. If you decide it would be best for you to be safe by staying at home, you have my approval as Pastor to do so. We are still going to live stream the Worship Service on the Church's Facebook page and it will still be available on the Church's YouTube page also. Please be aware also that with the social distancing rule of six feet between non-family members our Sanctuary will only hold about 50 people, which is less than our usual attendance.

You will find a copy of our Guidelines and Cleaning Procedures. Please read through them and let me know if you have any questions or concerns. The Deacons and the Staff have taken time to put these together for the safety of all who attend Worship Service.

Another fact I want to make you aware of is that one of our air conditioner units for the Sanctuary is not working and needs to be replaced. Wythe Sheet Metal has given us an estimate already. So as we move into the summer months, it may not be comfortable in the Sanctuary depending on the weather. If you plan on attending remember it could be warm in the Sanctuary.

Once again I want to say, Thank you for your faithful giving during this time! It has allowed us to cover all expenses and to continue to pay all our Staff. May God bless you for your continued faithfulness in this area. Please continue to pray for God's healing for our nation from COVID-19 and the current civil unrest. God will answer our prayers, just as God has done faithfully in the past for us.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES AND CLEANING PROCEDURE

These guidelines follow State guidelines and suggestions of best practices for churches gathering for Worship Services during Phase 2.

We are happy to report that Wytheville Baptist will begin gathering for Worship Service only on July 5, 2020 at 10:30 AM. We have established these guidelines and cleaning procedures to keep people safe during this time of Covid-19.

Worship Services will be limited to 50 people, this includes seating people in the balcony, so we can maintain six-foot distances between people.
 Our Worship Services will be live-streamed on the Church's Facebook page and posted later on the Church's YouTube page for those who cannot attend or who would prefer not to attend during this time of Covid-19.
 No one with a fever or known exposure to a Covid-19 case in the prior

14 days is allowed to enter the church building.

3. The Sanctuary, Bathrooms on the Second Floor, and all frequently touched surfaces will be cleaned after each Worship Service before meeting again as explained in the cleaning procedure detailed below.

4. People will enter the Sanctuary through the front door while maintaining six-foot distances and proceed to a pew for the Worship Service. Please do not pause because this may keep people from entering behind you. The pews will be marked in six-foot sections and only every other pew will be used. It will be helpful to fill in the Sanctuary from the front to the back so people can maintain six-foot distancing. If you are handicapped and need to use the ramp please let us know and you will be led in through the side door.

5. We will not have an announcement sheet. Our announcements will be on the projector screens.

6. Those who attend Worship Services are reminded to wear a face mask and each will use hand sanitizer upon entering our Sanctuary. If you forget to bring a face mask you will be given one to wear as you enter the sanctuary. The Pastor will remove his mask when he preaches.

7. Families who have been living together through the pandemic can sit together. All other attendees must be seated six feet apart.

8. We will not have our Greeting Time of hugging, handshakes, and moving around the Sanctuary.

9. Music has been very important to our Worship Services, however, there will be no Choir or Congregational singing during our Worship Services. Special Music and instrumentals will be part of our Worship Services from

time to time.

10. Other than the Sanctuary, no other parts of the Church facility will be open. Sunday School rooms, the Library, and the Choir Room are closed. Please do not go to the First or Third floors at this time. Any additional spaces people use will require cleaning each time they are used. The bathrooms will be open only on the Second floor.

11. Until further notice, there will be NO other Church activities held in the building.

12. The wearing of gloves is optional, but if you choose to wear gloves, they too need to be sanitized with hand sanitizer.

13. There will be an Offering box at the exit door to receive your offering. Offering plates will not be passed during the Worship Service. You can also continue to place your Offerings and Tithes through the mail slot in the door closest to the Office door during the week, mail it to the church, or use the online giving links either on the Church Website or through the My Church app.

14. At this time, no items can be passed from one person to another unless it is among the same family who have been living together during the stay-at-home orders.

15. After the worship service, the ushers will release one pew at a time to exit by the side door of the Sanctuary so we can maintain the required six-foot distance.

16. Those who chose to fellowship are required to do so outside the Church Building away from the exit while remaining at the six-foot distance.

CLEANING PROCEDURE BETWEEN WORSHIP SERVICES

 Our Cleaning Service will be responsible for sanitizing / disinfecting the restrooms. This will be done primarily with a bleach solution.
 Our Cleaning Service will also sanitize / disinfect the hard surfaces of

2. Our Cleaning Service will also sanitize / disinfect the hard surfaces of the entrance and exit doors to the sanctuary and in the hall.

3. A team of at least three individuals (members) will clean (sanitize / disinfect) the sanctuary each time the sanctuary is used. This will be done on or after Wednesday of each week. This cleaning will consist of wiping down of all the wood surfaces of the pews and other furniture. Lysol wipes and a non-bleach spray solution will be available for use. This would take less than an hour with two people. A steam cleaning machine will be used to sanitize / disinfect the fabric on the pews and any other needed fabric surfaces. The steam cleaning will likely take about 2 ¹/₂ hours.
