NOTES FROM OUR MINISTER OF MUSIC AND WORSHIP

LONGING TO SING ... TOGETHER!



Whether we have a good voice, or what we might consider a mediocre or bad one, we were created to sing God's praises—together—for all eternity. But there is a large void now—which I believe is also true for those who say they don't like to sing.

As I review the songs from our church services which Gary Carson has placed on the church website and YouTube, the memories of our singing together bring me much joy, yet remind me of the vacuum this virus has brought. The virus is a vicious thing, especially to vocal music—which I'm sure makes our enemy very happy. For you see, vocal singing involves deep breathing and expelling air to a much greater distance than just speaking, putting all to greater risk. This is why, even after we are able to gather physically, we may not be able to immediately sing corporately.

But I assure you that much research is being done on ways to safely bring vocal music back into church worship, for this is a worldwide concern. Further distancing and increased ventilation are required among other things. Some churches with high ceilings and ceiling fans, plus windows that open for cross ventilation may be able to open earlier with congregational singing than we can ... IF they can acquire the needed sanitizing agents which have become so rare.

Our concern is first for the safety of our members and visitors, so I don't know when we will be able to physically sing together again, but:

(1) We can sing aloud with the videos. Besides being spiritually uplifting, singing aloud also helps strengthen our lungs to resist the effects of the virus.

(2) We can also sing to the Lord while imagining ourselves surrounded by our beloved congregation. For our hearts, minds, and spirits were miraculously created to be able to join together in song without being physically together ... we are not limited by time and space while in the Lord. I somehow believe that when we ask the Lord to help us sing in our hearts with our brothers and sisters in Christ, even the angels will join in the chorus!

So, until we can join together in song, may our faithful Lord fill this longing with His loving Presence and the voices of His Heavenly Choir.



The Chautauqua Festival has been brought to you by the Wythe Arts Council for over 35 years and is a signature event for Wytheville, Wythe County, and all southwest Virginia.

The COVID-19 public health situation has forced us to reevaluate the plans for this year's event and required some tough decisions. Because of the uncertainty of what we will be facing in the next several weeks and the associated significant impacts to our planning and fundraising efforts, we have been forced to cancel Chautauqua as we know it for 2020.

This is not a decision we arrived at lightly, but the Wythe Arts Council Board must do what it thinks is best for the organization and the community at-large. Our festival was set to start just days after the expiration of the current order, and it's not certain when large-scale public gatherings will be permitted after that.

We're appreciative of the tremendous efforts already undertaken by those involved in working toward this year's festival, and we look forward to redoubling our efforts in the future.
