We are truly living in troubled times which call for faith-stretching. Pastor Tim's encouraging messages on Facebook and YouTube have done just that and kept us connected. I would also like to thank Gary Carson for stepping up to the plate to place online previous church solos and choir selections. How wonderful it is to see our choir and soloists singing in our beautiful sanctuary. It reminds us that God is still in control and that we will meet once more when it is safe to gather. That Sunday we will celebrate with a special Easter service, sharing a renewed faith and deeper joy because of what the Lord has brought us through.

Because how much like the original Passover and Resurrection Day we are still experiencing . . . sequestered in our homes protected by Jesus's blood as the death angel passes over . . . remaining hidden inside, just as the early disciples did after the crucifixion.

The following was shared by Allison Lanza, a friend of my cousin Kathy Smith, which I pray will encourage you as it has me:

"The very first Easter was not in a crowded worship space with singing and praising. On the very first Easter the disciples were locked in their house. It was dangerous for them to come out. They were afraid. They wanted to believe the good news they heard from the women, that Jesus had risen. But it seemed too good to be true. They were living in a time of such despair and such fear. If they left their homes their lives and the lives of their loved ones might be at risk. Could a miracle really have happened? Could life really have won out over death? Could this time of terror and fear really be coming to an end?

Alone in their homes they dared to believe that hope was possible, that the long night was over and morning had broken,

that God's love was the most powerful of all, even though it didn't seem quite real yet. Eventually, they were able to leave their homes, when the fear and danger had subsided, they went around celebrating and spreading the good news that Jesus was risen and love was the most powerful force on the earth.

This year, we might get to experience a taste of what that first Easter was like, still in our homes daring to believe that hope is on the horizon. Then, after a while, when it is safe for all people, when it is the most loving choice, we will come out, gathering together, singing and shouting the good news that God brings life even out of death, that love always has the final say!

This year we might get the closest taste we have had yet to what that first Easter was like."

So, in the waiting, take heart. For, as Baptist Pastor S. M. Lockridge first said, "It's Friday, but Sunday's a-comin'!"

Hi Pastor Tim and the Wytheville Baptist Church congregation, I hope this note finds you all happy, healthy, and safe.

I just wanted to take a minute and ask that you share a message with your church and all the wonderful people that attend.

I want to personally say that I hope all are doing well and are being vigilant in their safety of themselves and others to stay safe and healthy and help to stop the spread of this virus that is affecting us all. I want to say thank you for all that you do for myself and all of those children that you guys personally feed during the school year.

Although it is a much smaller group doing so, we continue to make sure that our children do not go hungry on their weekends, and with the challenges that we face, the numbers and needs are greater than normal. We shall share right at 1,000 hope packs this week alone which is a higher number than we usually do. Thanks to the partnership of both the Bland and Wythe school systems, we are partnering with each to share packs as they distribute meals to the school children each week.

We are doubling the number of packs at Bland currently and at the three high schools in Wythe the numbers grow each week. What is important to note is, that not all parents that pick up meals are taking hope packs which shows that the 1,000 packs that do and shared are more important to those families than ever. Nothing is going to waste here and every pack is used where needed.

It fills my heart with hope and faith for all of the wonderful things we are doing together to feed our friends, neighbors, and strangers alike.

To protect all of my friends and follow the guidelines, we are only allowed 10 people tops to pack which keeps the number to a small group. I put your health and safety first and foremost and will do all to protect every member of our "packs family" and cannot sing the praise of those that are giving it their all to be here for our children. We are all blessed to know folks like Wytheville Baptist Church and I shall be eternally grateful.

So, I just want to say I miss each of you but thank you for all that you do and your wonderful partnership. Hopefully, soon we'll all be back together in a new way but still, our hearts remain together no matter the distance.


