

PASTOR'S THOUGHTS JOIN WHAT GOD DOES

When we look back on Jesus' earthly life, we see a principle he followed which was difficult for the religious leaders of his time. It created a major part of the conflict between Jesus and the religious leaders. The religious leaders were concerned about keeping their religious system working the way it had for centuries. They had established rules, guidelines, and commandments that must be followed no matter what else was happening. Sometimes their "extras" made it even harder to be the people of God. Many times, following their ways, took the compassion and love out of being God's people. Jesus showed them a unique way to be God's people. Jesus' principle is summed up in John 5:19 (NIV).

Jesus gave them this answer: "Very truly I tell you, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does."

Instead of following set rules and guidelines, Jesus looked around to see what God was doing and then joined God in that work. There were times when God was at work on the Sabbath healing people and Jesus joined God in that work. The religious leaders complained because all work was against the rules of the Sabbath. Other times God was doing a new thing and when Jesus joined in the religious leaders claimed it could not be from God because they had never known God to do that before.

If we are meant to be God's people in this world, then we should live in the same way Jesus does. Jesus states very clearly that he is not able to do Kingdom work without God first starting the work. If this is true, then we must look around us and see what God is doing. When we see something happening that we know only God can do, then it is a place for us to discuss this question: "How can we join God in this Kingdom work?" God has allowed us to see it, thus inviting us to join God in the growing of the Kingdom of God.

So, now as the people of God at Wytheville Baptist, where do we see God at work around us? We need to look intently, pray deeply, discuss it with each other, and then take a step into the

work God is doing among us and around us. If we can do this, by the leading of the Holy Spirit, then we can grow spiritually, and we will see the Kingdom of God grow powerfully in our town.




