This is something the church should be helping people to discern. Yet, just as Samuel was already in the Temple, many are already part of the church and have great difficulty discerning God's presence and voice. The ability to discern God's presence and voice is the very foundation of our relationship with God.

Not only would the church have a more dynamic life, but our town and county would experience healing and wholeness if people better knew God's presence and voice. Imagine for a moment the love, peace, forgiveness, grace, and mercy that would exist between people when we can discern God's calling and guidance for us on our spiritual journey. This would be transformational to the church and the town of Wytheville.

If you have made a commitment to follow Jesus Christ, you have heard at least once God's voice and have experienced God's presence. It can and does happen repeatedly. Sometimes we are like Samuel and confuse the message, thinking it comes from another direction. As the church is experiencing a paradigm shift in how we operate, it is even more important for us to experience God.
