If this is something you do not know how to do, please let me know and we can talk about this together. It is important to the continuing of our community that you know how to help people accept Jesus Christ's work for them.

God is always about speaking to us and sharing with us on the spiritual journey. Sometimes what God shares with us can be a great help for someone else or even the community of faith. Some Christians tend to see their walk with God as a very private event that they never talk about. This is not a biblical idea of the spiritual journey. Our learning on our journey with God should be shared with other people because it may help them, encourage them, or inspire them to walk in a deeper way also. Think about it, when was the last time you shared with another Christian the latest concept God shared with you? If it has been a while, you are missing out on one of the greatest and most wonderful parts of Christian fellowship.

Be serious with yourself and evaluate your spiritual life and your commitment to these two tasks. Take the opportunities God supplies to learn how to do them better. Even call your

pastor and seek to learn how to do them better so you will influence the people of this world, an effect that has eternal consequences.

•Bland Ministry Center: Director Dee Dee Hoosier expressed appreciation for all the prayers and support during her surgeries, sickness and loss of her husband. She reported that the Food pantry is averaging about 50 families a week. The Clothes Closet is only open one day a week, but if CoVid numbers keep falling, they plan to reopen for the second day of each week. The Bluefield College food pantry is being utilized heavily. We certainly appreciate the support provided to us by the network. The school dental program has started. Over sixty kids have been screened thus far. At Spiller Elementary in Wytheville, at least 20% of those screened had urgent dental needs, one had two permanent front teeth with so much decay, they may not be salvageable.

•Venezuela Ministry: Pastor Ramon sent pictures of recent activities including a football (soccer) tournament for kids. They provided a meal for 142 as an outreach. In a near-by neighborhood where there is no Baptist presence they will soon start a small cell in a home. They are trying to buy a house in another neighborhood. Pastor Ramon expressed his deep-felt gratitude to our Network for the Resolution that was read at the constitution of the God With Us Baptist Church. Pastor Ramon has accepted the call to be pastor of this newly constituted church. He expressed appreciation for our prayers and financial assistance.

As we look forward to the future, please continue to pray for our Network churches and our country.

Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.




On Thursday, May 6, please partner with us as we stop from our daily routine to pray and spend time seeking God's mercy, grace, and salvation for all people.
