What Your Pastor-Church Relations Team Has Been Doing

Early last fall, as we began to think about Pastor Tim's Sabbatical, the Pastor-Church Relations Team added Ty King, Tommy Hilton and Dee Nolan to our current membership of Linda Sutphin. Cathy Valley and Pastor Tim. The church body voted to apply for a Clergy Renewal Program Grant in the spring of 2022. In October 2022, we began to plan for Pastor Tim's Sabbatical and the Renewal activities for the church during that 3month period. These plans included the process of completing the application for the Lilly Endowment Renewal Grant. This grant, if awarded, would fund Pastor Tim's expenses, the Interim Pastor's fee, and Renewal activities for the church. We realized one meeting a month was not enough and voted to meet twice each month. Some of the meetings were workshops lasting 2-3 hours. The team agreed to compile and distribute to the WBC Congregation an informative brochure about the Sabbatical. The brochure was completed and distributed to every family in November. Also, in November, we saw the current copy of the 2023 application for this grant and learned the due date would be March 13, 2023.


In January the team felt the Lord's leading toward an emphasis on prayer for the church's renewal. The book, <u>How to Pray: A simple Prayer</u> <u>Guide for Normal People</u> by Pete Greig was chosen as the book to study. It was decided that a kick-off for the book study would be held at Loretto Mansion, to include a guest speaker, lunch and small-group discussions. In addition, a picnic at Claytor Lake Baptist Camp would conclude the Renewal and welcome Pastor Tim and DeAnne back to our church.

In February the responsibilities of the Interim Pastor were discussed and work on the application began in earnest. Team members discussed their assigned questions. Expenses were discussed and budgets were compiled for Pastor Tim's Sabbatical and the congregation's activities, including payment for Interim Pastor and cost of books for study. Members were assigned application questions to prepare for the next meeting as Pastor Tim completed his section of the document. The application was completed, edited carefully and submitted prior to the March 13 deadline.

The team continued to plan activities for this time in the life of Wytheville Baptist Church. An Interim Pastor-Church Covenant was completed and approved by the team in June.

After a break in July the team will meet in August to begin the search process for an Interim Pastor. We should hear from the Lilly Foundation by late August. Please continue to pray as we wait for news and as we continue to prepare for this exciting time of Renewal and Spiritual growth for our Pastor, DeAnne, and Wytheville Baptist Church.

Notes from our Minister of Music and Worship

I have always been fascinated by fields of sunflowers; how in the mornings they look to the sun in the east and then slowly follow the sun until it sets in the west. It's amazing to watch a large field of sunflowers do this in unison.

These magnificent towering flowers intrigued me to the point I had to research them and find out more about this God given phenomenon of flowers dancing in the sunlight. My research drew my attention to the lessons God was trying to show me through these flowers.

I found out that a field of juvenile sunflowers are the only ones that track the sun in unity. Can you imagine the impact on the world if the community of faith would have this kind of unity and move together in the light of God's love. That reminded me of the verse in Psalm 133:1

How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!

Just like the field of juvenile sunflowers that caught my eye as they moved with the sun, so too can the community of faith catch the attention of non-believers when we are unified in God's love.

I also found out that the mature sunflowers only face east; they do not track the sun. Research says this is because east-facing sunflowers are more effectively warmed by the morning sun. If we steadfastly keep our face and our attention turned continually toward warmth, love, and light of God through God's Word, we will, as scripture says in Isaiah 60:19:

The sun will no more be your light by day, nor will the brightness of the moon shine on you, for the Lord will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory.

I also found that mature east-facing sunflowers attract up to five times the number of pollinators than others. If we stay in God's Word, He will multiply our knowledge, help us grow in His wisdom, and help us produce disciples. It says in Proverbs 2:6, 10

For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding. For wisdom will enter your heart, and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul.

But there is another type of wild sunflower that grows on the side of highways and in fields. They have also been labeled "weeds." They have small flowers, they branch out with spindly stalks, and the flowers never face the sun together. One will face up, another will face down, still others will be blown by the wind. Does that remind you of some in the churches today. God's Word says in 1 Corinthians 1:10

I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought.

God has shown Himself powerfully in the way He created this flower plus all the beauty of the earth for us to enjoy, take care of, and learn from.

As I look at the sunflower my heart is filled and I begin to sing a wonderful old song

"Heavenly sunlight, heavenly sunlight, flooding my soul with glory divine: hallelujah, I am rejoicing, singing His praises, Jesus is mine."

I continue singing that song joyfully because God's love has filled my soul with His Son's Light.

Staff and volunteers will bring out orders as they are ready.

Guests choosing to volunteer will work with our volunteer manager. After the ¹/₂ volunteer contribution is made, guests will receive a volunteer meal voucher and proceed to the service counter.

Open Door Café has the ability for online ordering. Just go to their website and click the order online box. They continue to have the capability of catering to your event.

WIND RIVER INDIAN RESERVATION MISSIONARIES TO SPEAK AT WBC

You may remember years ago Michael and Monica Brennan led a Christian summer camp for children in our community. They now minister to the Wind River Indian Reservation in Wyoming doing church work and a free summer camp.

The reservation is home to bitter ancestral enemies: the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho tribes. Even among reservations, it's renowned for brutal crime, widespread drug use, and legal dumping of toxic waste. For many years, the church has conflated evangelism with colonialism. Indian country now largely believes that they must abandon all their nativeness to become a Christian. One of the greatest obstacles to presenting the gospel on Wind River Reservation is unresolved anger, distrust, hatred, and bitterness toward Euro-Americans. Only the truth of Jesus Christ can overcome such obstacles.

Mike and Monica will join us on Wednesday night, August 23, at 6:00 p.m. for supper and then speak to us during our Spiritual Conversation time and tell us about God's ministry to the people of Wind River Indian Reservation through them. You don't want to

miss this informative and moving presentation by Missionaries who want to see God's love spread to these indigenous people.
