PASTOR'S THOUGHTS A Daily Lifeline

Prayer happens every day for me in multiple ways. They are my first words to God as I get out of bed in the morning. They are the last words I think every day as I lay in bed falling asleep. Other times prayer is my moment before eating to give thanks for the provisions. When I drive, if I am not working on memory verses, I usually am speaking with God about my day.
