Something New

With a new year comes a new path for everyone at Wytheville Baptist. Soon we begin our Lenten journey toward Easter. Easter is the celebration of God's victory over death with the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. My prayer is that you will participate in the Soup and the Word luncheons hosted by different churches to prepare yourself anew for Easter morning. Then Easter Monday, my sabbatical starts.

This will be a time of renewal and re -creation not only for me but also for the church. I do not know what to expect in many ways for my journey during these three months. I have spent time each week over the past 25 years preparing sermons, Bible studies, Sunday School lessons, and small group meetings. All these things will be set aside

for a time of deeper personal spiritual journey. This is different because at times I have often helped other people on their journeys before attending to my journey. Being able to spend each day drawing closer to God without all the other preparations will be something I have not experienced in a long time.

The church will also have the opportunity for renewal by studying a book about prayer. The Pastor-Church Relations Team and the Staff spent this past fall preparing to lead and guide you through this time. A one-day retreat is planned to begin the time at the Loretto Mansion. Kerra English, a pastor, and spiritual director from the Richmond area, will lead the retreat. She was on the staff at the Spiritual Directors school I attended from 2014-2016. I know you will enjoy and be challenged by what she shares with you. Then each Wednesday at 6:45 PM, the church will watch a video about prayer and then move into a small group to discuss the video and experience the type of prayer discussed. These videos will also be shown on Sunday mornings at 9 AM for those who cannot make Wednesday evenings. If you have questions about these activities, please contact a member of the Pastor-Church Relations Team or Staff.

When I return in July, times will be scheduled for us to share our experiences during the sabbatical. I expect us to find a great common ground that will allow us to take a deeper journey as a community of faith. The Team, Staff, and I believe God is leading us into a revival and greater influence in our town and community.

Please be in prayer about the commitment God is asking for you to make to this important time of revival. If each one of us makes ourselves fully available to God, we will see a powerful work of God in and through us.

BLAND MINISTRY CENTER: Dee Dee Hoosier emailed the following report: "We are preparing for our food box distribution. We will be handing out 600 food boxes next week. During the month of November 731 food boxes were distributed out of the food pantry, there were 43 families from Pulaski,

Giles, and Montgomery receiving food.

The home food delivery program is growing. We currently have 46 families receiving home delivery every month. The grant for this program will be ending in March, but we have already received funding to help with it next year.

We are still waiting to hear from the federal grant for the new dental clinic.

Susan Keene and I attended the BGAV annual meeting in Richmond.

The transition to being an independent 501c3 is still ongoing. The wheels of lawyers move slowly. We are hopeful to at least have the transfer of property completed by the end of January. We thank the WBRBN for increasing the giving to Bland Minis-

try Center for the upcoming year.

As we look forward to the future, please continue to pray for our Network churches and our country.
