

PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

How Do You Define Prayer?

A neighbor approaches and asks, "What is prayer?" How do you answer your neighbor? Take a moment and answer this question. The simplest answer: It is a conversation with God. The next question: "What topics are in this conversation?" A common answer: "I speak to God about the things of this world that need fixing." For a lot of people, this is prayer.

Bringing requests to God should be only a small part of prayer. Prayer of this type is one-way communication, and this is not a conversation with God. It is like a small child constantly asking for something repeatedly. Prayer time should include time to allow God to speak to us. A Christian life that cannot hear God speak will be a sad and frustrating jour-



ney. Then prayer should also include adoration, contemplation, confession, and reconciliation. The best form of prayer is a conversation with God that continues throughout the better part of your day.

If your definition of prayer does not include all these pieces, there is an opportunity for you to learn more about prayer soon. April 13 at the Loretto Historic Mansion, the church is sponsoring a retreat about prayer, lunch is included. Kerra English, a friend from Spiritual Directors School, is coming to share about prayer. I have seen her outline for the retreat, and it is wonderful! This one-day retreat begins three months of focus on learning about prayer. A church-wide study of the book How to Pray: A Simple Guide for Normal People by Pete Greig will meet on Sundays at 9 AM and Wednesdays at 6:45 PM. The church has purchased the book for you already. You will only need to attend one of the sessions each week. During each session, a 15 to 20-minute video will be followed by a time of small group discussion. The Pastor-Church Relations Team and the Staff studied this book last fall. They are prepared to walk with you into a deeper understanding of prayer.

I look forward to this time and pray that it will be a rich experience for you. If you attend the retreat and the sessions, I know you will bring away a much deeper understanding of prayer. I also believe you will be able to hear God's voice, guidance, and direction more each day. Please make plans to attend now.
