This leads us to our next prayer course study. Pete Greig has written a book called God on Mute. Along with this book, there is a video series called *The Unanswered Prayer Course*. One quote that stands out to me from Pete, "The Bible is more honest about unanswered prayer than the church is willing to be." I have watched the first two videos and begun reading the book. WOW! They are just as powerful as the previous series you did while I was on Sabbatical.

We are going to start this series on Sunday, September 29, at 8:45 AM in the Fellowship Hall and Wednesday, October 2 at 6:30 PM. As with the How to Pray book, Sunday and Wednesday will be the same video each week. We are starting at both times 15 minutes earlier because the videos for this series are about 30 minutes instead of 15 minutes. This is a five-week course, and we will finish it in November. A member of the church, who believes deeply in what we are doing, has given the money to purchase books for those who want to attend. If you do not have a book yet, they are available in the church office.

Please consider attending as we continue to learn and deepen our understanding of prayer together. I expect we will grow as a church in a powerful way through this study.

- **BLAND MINISTRY:** DeeDee Hoosier reported the following: "Thank you to WBRBN for the use of the Camp on July 20 for BMC's company picnic. Approximately 25 people were in attendance and had a great time using this great facility. The mission teams are still working on projects and will continue throughout the summer into early fall. "We are currently averaging 725 food boxes per month (households served). April – 166 families 475 individuals 725 pounds, May - 171 families 679 individuals 676 pounds, June - 177 families 416 individuals 682 pounds, July - 139 families 404 individuals 492 pounds. "Recently I asked the volunteers that receive food boxes to calculate what the total cost of items received would be if purchased in the stores. A total of \$384 was calculated. The home food delivery program is averaging approximately 45 Bland County families per month. We are about to open to Grayson, Carroll and Galax Counties for dental services. They have just recently reopened their free clinic, but unfortunately have been unable to staff the clinic. Dr. Filanova will work 4 days a month at this clinic providing care to the residents of these counties. The land has been transferred out of ERBA (East River Baptist Association) and into BMC's name. We are still waiting on the 501c3 confirmation."
