#### Youth Evangelism Strategies—Missionaries to Wind River Indian Reservation, Wyoming



Exciting things are happening on the Safe House front! Even now, we have young ladies on the Wind River Reservation that need a home of refuge to escape trafficking. We have already been working towards their rescue. We ask you to search your heart and commit these young ladies to prayer. Sadly, often rescuing takes the form of buying somebody out of modern-day slavery. Furthermore,

it takes having a safe home to move them to; one that is Christ centered, confidential, remote, with an environment that accommodates and promotes healing and where Monica can provide trauma based, Christ centered, mental health counseling.

According to all the statistics, rescue ministries, law enforcement and people in the know, one of the greatest needs right now is facilities with which to lace those rescued. It would be unconscionable and sadly lacking to place them in a secular, austere multi-bed facility when they need so much more! We have never felt God pressing us as hard about anything as He is about this need. We are sure that He is using all our past and has shaped us for such a time as this. We are praying diligently and have set a goal to raise a \$100,000 by the end of the year for the safe house. Monica recently wrote, "Tolerance of trafficking is the acceptance of ignorance in the most horrific tyranny. It is in total opposition to the alignment God has with those suffering as His image bearers." Therefore, we want to give everyone the opportunity to put feet to their knowledge and prayers and donate to this need.
