- Thomas Cundiff read the letter from Mountain Top Church: "We at Mountain Top Baptist Church would like to be considered to join your Network. Charles stated that at the Annual Meeting a representative of the church will attend and ask to become a full member of the Network. Motion passed.
- Venezuela Ministry: Charles Damron shared that the latest letter from Pastor Ramon expresses appreciation for the funds the Network sends, but more appreciation for the prayer support. Pastor Ramon said over 60 children are fed on Sunday mornings and then the families are fed after service. They collect food, mattresses, clothing for those that have experienced flooding. He asked for prayer for the funds for his son's next semester's expenses.
- . Bland Ministry: Charles told Dee Dee Hoosier it was good to see her again. She introduced Riley, a summer intern. Dee Dee shared that over 800 families are being served through the food pantry. She suggested that VT and RU consider sending students to help on the 4th Thursday of each month to help with "Work Force", 4:00-6:00 p.m. to distribute food. Last week they had 70. She said the transition to become independent is moving ahead. They are in the middle of the home repair season. The golf tournament was in June. The funds will go toward home repair. She expressed appreciation for the prayers offered during her surgery and recovery.
