#### **PASTOR'S THOUGHTS**

#### Living the Best

This year we are focusing on learning about spiritual discernment. This process started a few years ago when we looked at what it meant to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. We searched through the scriptures reading and studying the passages every Christian should know. The scriptures teach us about the basic principles that God wants every Christian to live if we are going to follow Jesus Christ as our Savior and Lord. When we know the scriptures well, then we have a great foundation for our spiritual journey.

Last year, the church took a big step to learn more about prayer. Prayer is key to developing and deepening a personal relationship with a loving God who wants a conversation with us every day. Prayer provides an opportunity not only to voice our concerns to God but also to hear God speak personally to us. Silence should always be part

Paul's prayer for the Philippian church is also my prayer for us on this journey together.

And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God. Philippians 1:9-11 (NIV)

Please join us on Sunday mornings at 9 AM and on Wednesday evenings at 6:45 PM as we study how to discern God's will as an individual and as a part of the community of faith.

#### WEDNESDAY NIGHT SUPPER UPDATE


