

PASTOR'S THOUGHTS DISTRACTIONS AND THE **SPIRITUAL JOURNEY**

Distractions abound in our culture. They come at us from every angle to busy all our senses. We can learn not to allow these things to distract our focus on what is important. Yet often these distractions capture us and pull us away from maintaining our concentration on the path we are trying to walk. This especially happens when we try to live a spiritual journey. There are many distractions and some of them are even good, but not the best God has planned for us.

Scripture tells us distractions will happen and instructs us on how to handle them. Look at Proverbs 4:25-27 (NIV) as one example.

25 Let your eyes look straight ahead; fix your gaze directly before you.

26 Give careful thought to the paths for your feet and be steadfast in all your ways.27 Do not turn to the right or the left; keep your foot from evil.

It tells us to keep our focus straight ahead, to watch where we place our feet, and to maintain a steadfast heart to walk the right path. Wonderful insight and wisdom yet often the distractions get louder when we try to maintain our focus.

This is where Henri Nouwen helps with a story (from Making all Things New).

Listen to "the experience of a man who, after years of living with open doors, suddenly decides to shut them. The visitors who used to come and enter his home start pounding on his doors, wondering why they are not allowed to enter. Only when they realize that they are not welcome do they gradually stop coming. This is the experience of anyone who decides to enter into solitude [or walking a deeper spiritual journey] after a life without much spiritual discipline. At first, the many distractions keep presenting themselves. Later, as they receive less and less attention, they slowly withdraw."

My prayer for you is that you would learn to "shut the doors" and give the distractions "less and less attention" so you can live the blessed path God has for you.

There is a song written by Frank Pugh that was designated as the official song of the Commonwealth, House Bill No. 2554, in 2009, and that I have sung many, many times. I especially enjoyed singing it for the men and women that rode their motorcycles into Wytheville as they participated in Run for the Wall. To me this song not only speaks of our nation's flag, but also when the words are sung "and the banner yet waves" it reminds me of the Lord's name—YAHWEH-NISSI—meaning "The Lord Our Banner."

When Moses was leading the people of Israel and the Amalekites came against them, he stood on top of a hill with the staff of God in his hands. When Moses held up his hands, Israel prevailed and when he became tired and lowered his hands, Amalekites prevailed. So Aaron and Hur got him a rock to sit on and then held up his hands and God gave them victory. 
