

We now have a contract on our house! So, we can now move forward on some things. We have estimated that the move alone will be about \$12,000. This includes shipping our vehicle, a rental car while we wait for our truck to arrive by ship, lodging while we wait to close on the safe house, airline tickets and shipping of some personal items. We would appreciate some financial help with this if anyone is in a position to donate to this.
