Most people have a desire to control situations, especially ones with an unknown outcome. Our vision of the future can only be preserved by setting up the dominoes in the pattern that makes sense to us. Two problems with this view. Every person has their own specific pattern to create the outcome they believe is best. Plus, many believe their vision of the future is the only possible good outcome. I want to ask you to consider this quote from one of Francois Fenelon's letters.

The future is in God's hands, not yours. God will rule it accordingly to your need. But if you seek to forecast it in your own wisdom, you will gain nothing but anxiety and anticipation of inevitable trouble. Try only to make use of each day; each day brings its own good and evil, and sometimes what seems evil becomes good if we leave it to God, and do not forestall [God] with our impatience.

Please take some time to digest this quote. Are you ready to allow God room to put things together and in the right time?


- The next bi-monthly meeting is Thursday, October 2, 2025, at Dublin Baptist Church.

- Bland Ministry: Dee Dee Hoosier shared that over 1000 families are being served through the food pantry, 250 families each week. And she shared that 500 families have been served by the Clothes Closet. She said they have received a donation of dog food, both for adult dogs and puppies. She said it is available to animal and rescue shelters. The mission teams are coming each week doing repairs on houses and will be coming through the end of October. She said they are getting bids for the construction of the new Dental Clinic; bids are due by August 26. The Annual Back-to-School event saw 92 at the "Foam Party" for elementary students; the high school students will have their event next week.
- Hearts and Hammers: Dave Clonch shared that a Mission Team from SC assisted H&H in building 2 new ramps and a team from Ohio assisted in building one ramp. One of the things they do is witness during work and they have seen results. He said they have one more ramp to do this year.
- Venezuela Ministry: Charles Damron shared that the latest letter from Pastor Ramon saying before Sunday morning service children are feed breakfast and then the families are fed after service. In his prayer requests he included a request for the groups doing discipleship training. He led a group of six and now those six will lead two discipleship groups of six people each; with currently 18 people who are in discipleship.
